**CHANGES TO THE MUNICIPAL CODE'S DENSITY BONUS CHAPTER**

The public is invited to a City of Cupertino City Council meeting on **Tuesday, April 6, 2021 at 6:45 pm** at which time the Council will conduct:

A public hearing to consider a Municipal Code Amendment to adopt changes to Chapter 19.56, Density Bonus, of the Cupertino Municipal Code to allow increased density bonuses for projects providing higher percentages of affordable units in a housing development project. The density bonuses vary by income level.

**Environmental Recommendation: Exempt (Common Sense Exemption, Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3)).**

The Planning Commission considered the proposed Municipal Code Amendments at its regular meeting on Tuesday, February 23, 2021 and recommended with a 4-1 vote (No: Kapil) that the Council adopt the draft ordinance to find the project exempt from CEQA and adopt the changes.
